Why Organized Dentistry?

In his 2009 book *Start with Why*, Simon Sinek says, "People don't buy what you do, they buy why you do it." From Southwest Airlines to Apple, he explains how companies that are clear on their mission are able to gain loyalty from their customers. A simple lesson, but harder to put into practice. So with the ODA Annual Session and tripartite memberships coming due, it's worth asking the question: WHY organized dentistry?

This fall, Case Western Reserve University and The Ohio State University welcomed 77 and 120 students, respectively, into their dental schools. Those men and women donned their white coats and started a journey that will soon bring them into our profession. We can't predict how many of the 197 will stay in Ohio after graduation, but at some point, in 2027 we need to be able to answer the question of why. Why should they join organized dentistry?

I'm not talking about why in a philosophical sense. Like legendary explorer Sir Edmund Hilary, who, when asked why he climbed Mount Everest replied simply, "Because it was there." No, at the GCDS we are currently answering the question of "why" with concrete benefits.

To provide learning opportunities for members. There are multiple unique CE

events happening this fall. We will have Dr. Kelly Kirtland speaking about pediatrics; Dr. Kelly Misch delving into extractions and implant placement; and our own Drs. Andrea Nunney and Joseph Charnas discussing the current epidemic of cracked teeth. These speakers are chosen to provide the latest developments in our field.

Benefit of Membership

- Register online with the ODA Services Corp. Group Purchase Organization - this registration form is on the ODA website under MEMBER CENTER - ENDORSED PRODUCTS, SERVICES & DISCOUNTS - DENTAL SUPPLIES & EQUIPMENT
- (There's also a downloadable form which could be sent to odasc@oda.org or sent to Chris Rotella, COO of ODASC, at chrisr@oda.org).
- Chris will email you a username/ password through Safco if you don't already have one, and you can get started ordering right away!

To get a breakdown of savings through Safco/OhioDDS:

- Send 3-12 months of supply invoices to Chris Rotella (chrisr@oda.org), and he will have the team at Safco perform a free expense audit. I sent a fax with the printed invoices, but easily could have downloaded the invoices and emailed them.

The expense audit took the Safco team two business days and they procured a significant (over 30%) savings for us. While I only sent three months of expenses to the Safco team to review, the savings they showed over just three months was enough to pay for my entire year of Tripartite dues for this year and most of next year!

One thing to be aware of is that the savings seem to mostly come in the form of payment credits towards future purchases. So, if a team member is the one ordering (and used to price comparing), they will need to be aware that they are paying the retail price and the credit will be applied to the account for the next purchase.

There's no cost or downside to joining and having the analysis run. Everyone at the ODA Service Corp wants ODA dentists to succeed and I found them, especially Chris, incredibly easy and helpful to work with.

I would love any ODA business owners to try this for yourselves and let me know what happens! Happy savings!!

INFANT AND TODDLER EXAMS AND RECALLS: WHO, WHAT, WHEN, WHERE, AND HOW?

EXTRACTIONS & SUCCESSFUL SOCKET REGENERATION TECHNIQUES

TISSUE MANAGEMENT OF ANTERIOR IMPLANTS

In this program, two similar cases will be showcased involving flap elevation, surgical extraction with sectioning and socket grafting of fractured mandibular molars. Participants will view clinical procedures performed by a highly skilled clinician who will explain and showcase advanced surgical and restorative techniques, helping participants to implement them into their practices.

Objectives:

- Learn how to predictably section a molar tooth with a vertical root fracture with and without a crown.
- Learn how to manage the flap around the socket and effectively adapt to resorbable collagen membrane over the bone graft with a dehiscenced bony plate.
- Learn how to choose which membrane to use and where to use it with bone grafting socket regeneration procedures.



Kelly A. Misch, DDS, MS, PC graduated from the University of Michigan with a dental degree and a Master of Science in Periodontics. She is board certified in periodontology by the American Board of Periodontology and the International Congress of Oral Implantologists. Dr. Misch is a full-time partner in three active private practices in Southeast Michigan that specialize in periodontics and implant dentistry. She is also a Co-Founder/Director of Comprehensive Dental Institute, a Michigan non-profit organization whose

CRACKED AND FRACTURED TEETH: A REVIEW OF TREATMENT OPTIONS

The incidence of cracked teeth have continued to increase over the last few years. After the pandemic the incidence has seemed to increase even more. We will review the different types of cracked teeth. Review diagnosing cracked teeth and vertical root fractures. Discuss treatment options for cracked teeth and vertical root fractures.



Kelly Kirtland, DDS, MS, MA, MBA was born and raised in Cleveland, Ohio. As a young girl she developed a love for all things water. This love led her to her first career as a lifeguard on one of Lake Erie's beautiful beaches.

Dr. Nunney received her Bachelor of Arts degree from Ohio Wesleyan University. She went on to attend Case Western Reserve University where she received her Master of Science degree in Anatomy. While at Case Western, Dr. Nunney and a small team of researchers studied oral epithelial mucosa to better understand cancer cells. Her research findings were published in the medical journal, *Oral Oncology*, in August 2009.

Upon graduating from Case Western, she pursued a Doctor of Dental Surgery degree at the University of Illinois at Chicago where she received many clinical and academic honors prior to graduating at the top of her class. Immediately following dental school, Dr. Nunney remained at the University of Illinois at Chicago and completed her advanced specialty training in Endodontics.

Special thanks to Greg Jagger at CWRU SODM for arranging acquisition and return of the mobile dental chairs for the event.

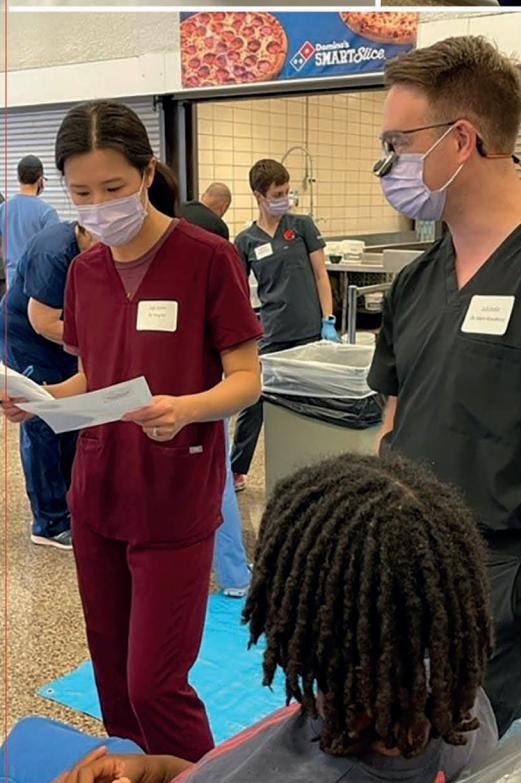

Why Advocacy is Important

In my last article, I passed along the BIG NEWS that the House of Representatives had already passed the operating budget for FY 2024/25 which includes, at the urging of Ohio dentists, a major increase in dental Medicaid reimbursement rates to 65% of private dental insurance fee levels.

This summer, through lobbying efforts for the biennial budget, the ODA was able to help with the historic increase in dental Medicaid reimbursement, something that had not been achieved in 23 years, as the Senate passed the budget with the Medicaid increase included and Governor Mike DeWine signed it into law. This remedy will go far to ensure access to dental care for Ohio's most vulnerable citizens. The ODA is finalizing the reimbursement increase this summer, working with the Ohio Department of Medicaid. In January 2024, **Medicaid reimbursement will be increased by 93% for dental services.**

Senate Bill 40 passed the Senate unanimously and has had one hearing in the House. This bill will enter Ohio into the Dentist and Dental Hygienist licensure compact. The ODA anticipates that this bill will move through the House shortly after they return in the fall. Similar to the Medical Licensure Compact and Nurse Licensure Compact, with passage of this law, Ohio will join the Dentist and Dental Hygienist Licensure Compact which will create reciprocity among participating states and reduce barriers to licensure. In today's mobile society with high demand for our services, licensure, without reducing standards, should be available to those providers who wish to move to Ohio.

On another note, there has been no further momentum on introducing legislation for mid-level providers. However, this is a topic of discussion that continues with every legislator to educate them on such a radical proposal should any interest return.

Lastly, the ODA lobbying team has been meeting with legislators throughout the summer to discuss non-covered services. The Senate Insurance committee has had three hearings on the bill (SB 115) and we are actively working with the committee to have a vote when they return in the fall (late September or Early October). Further, the House version (HB 160) heard testimony from the House Insurance committee. If the bill moves out of the Senate, that will be the vehicle to get the ball across the finish line in the House. This proposal has been debated for over a decade in the Ohio

Statehouse and we are now confident it can be passed by the full legislature and on to the governor for signature. Forty-four states have passed a bill banning this unfair practice. Ohio is one of six states still not to have passed a bill on this issue. The current bills would prohibit the unfair insurance company practice of dictating the fees of non-covered services to participating providers. Please call your legislators and ask them to SUPPORT Senate Bill 115 and House Bill 160.

WE NEED OUR VOICE HEARD!! If you've never been a Capital Club or ODPAC member or if you've been a consistent supporter over the years, now is one of the most important times to contribute to the ongoing voice Ohio dentists have in our state. As we all know all too well at this point, state regulations affect ALL dentists, young and old, solo and group practitioners, owners and associates, DSOs and private practices alike. Let's make sure that when the state of Ohio considers regulating our businesses again, we have a voice to protect our destiny.

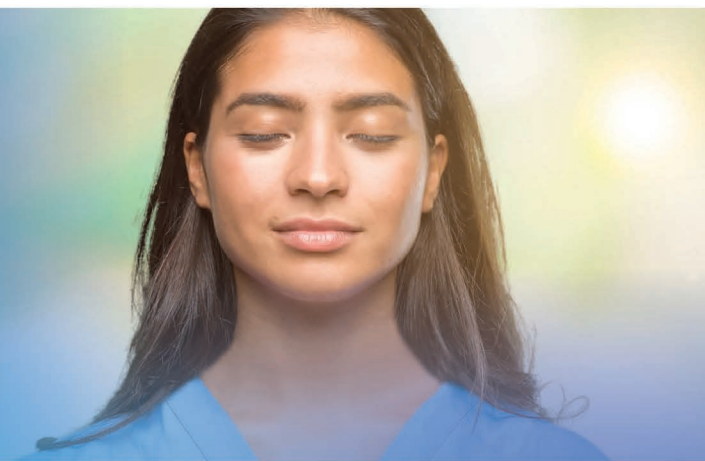
Figure 1. The six signature traits of an inclusive leader

On behalf of the Case Western Reserve University Student Run Health Clinic, we are reaching out to you in hopes of recruiting additional licensed dentists to volunteer with us. We are in need of additional dental preceptors to oversee our dental student volunteers during clinic days.

The CWRU Student Run Health Clinic has been in operation for almost 10 years now, and while it has moved locations, adapted to the challenges of the recent Covid-19 pandemic, and integrated additional health professional programs, it is still going strong! Our clinic is currently held at Neighborhood Family Practice (3545 Ridge Rd, Cleveland, OH 44102) and typically operates every other Saturday of each month from 8 AM to 2 PM.
